### Why is a belief in our children's ability to learn mathematics essential?

Before your child can learn mathematics, he or she needs to believe in his or her ability to do so. That's where you come in. You can be your child's first role model for learning. When you engage with your child in a supportive, relaxed atmosphere, your child will enjoy taking risks while having fun with math! Understanding mathematics builds confidence and opens doors to many jobs and careers. Understanding mathematics enables us to:

- Solve problems and make sound decisions
- Explain how we solved a problem and why we made a particular decision
- Use technology (such as calculators and computer applications) to help solve problems
- Understand patterns and trends so that we can make predictions (for example, we can keep track of how much juice is consumed so that we know how much juice to buy each week)
- Manage our time and money (for example, we can calculate how much time we need to get to work, how much food we need to make meals and how much money we need to buy food)
- Handle everyday situations that involve numbers (such as figuring out when the next bus will arrive and dividing a recipe).

### Stop the spread of Infection

### When to keep your child at home...

Please keep your child at home and away from others if he or she has any of these symptoms: fever, diarrhea, vomiting, rash, frequent coughing or sneezing, yellow or green discharge from the nose, ears, or eyes, sore throat. Children can return once they have been 24 hours free of vomiting.

### Safety Reinders for Parents

To keep Westmount students / staff as safe as possible **parents** are reminded:

1. that they are not allowed on back field/tarmac area before school. This has been mandated by the DSBN and is outlined in the DSBN Parents' Guide online.
2. that they are not permitted in the school. If you need to speak to a staff member please call and arrange a telephone call.
3. to supply your child(ren) with a lunch when they come to school in the morning so you, the parent, don't have to come to the school and drop one off later in the day.
4. to keep your child(ren) at home when they are not feeling well especially if they are suffering from a cough, temperature, runny nose and/or sore throat etc. **Thank you!**
